Title 1 and AIS are intended to target students who are either:

- at risk of not achieving NYS learning standards in ELA, Mathematics, Social Studies, and/or Science
- at risk of not gaining the knowledge and skills needed to meet or exceed designated performance levels on NYS assessments

Parent Involvement

- Parents will receive an introductory letter, an intervention plan of services, and reasoning for services.
- Progress reports will be distributed by mail, telephone, telecommunications or other means each quarter.

What is AIS? What is Title 1?



AIS (Academic Intervention Services) refers to additional instruction that supports and supplements classroom curriculum. The goal of AIS is to help students build skills to successfully meet NYS learning standards.

Title 1 is the largest federal aid program for elementary and secondary schools. This program supports supplementary services designed to improve the educational performance of low-achieving children in high-poverty schools.

Under the core Title 1 program, school districts receive federal funds through a multi-step allocation process.

The federal grants are allocated according to a legislative formula based mainly on the distribution of low-income children and state per-pupil expenditures. However, once the funds reach the participating schools, children in those schools are selected for services on the basis of academic performance, regardless of income.

How did my child get chosen to receive Title 1/AIS Services?

All school districts are required to have a district wide procedure that meets NYS criteria and that is applied uniformly at each grade level when determining who receives services. The following are the CRCS district procedures:

Grades K-3

Students in grades K-3 will receive Title 1/AIS services when the following criteria has been met:

- The student has a lack in reading readiness based on an appraisal of the student, including his/her knowledge of sounds and letters.
- The student is determined to be at risk of not achieving the NYS designated performance level in ELA and/or Mathematics.



Grades 4-12

Students in grades 4 - 12 will receive Title 1/AIS services when the following criteria has been met:

- The student scores below the NYS designated performance levels on one or more NYS assessments in ELA, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science.
- The student is an English Language Learner and is determined to be at risk of not achieving NYS learning standards in ELA, Mathematics, Social Studies, or Science through English or the student's native language.
- The student is determined to be at risk of not achieving NYS standards in ELA, Mathematics, Social Studies, or Science.
